LETTER FROM THE CEO

Chattahoochee Nature Center (CNC) is embarking on an exciting new chapter driven by a strong vision and community backing. With a dedicated Board leading the charge, CNC has successfully onboarded seven new board members and established an endowment through a challenge grant, setting the stage for long-term sustainability.

Partnership growth and expansion were a priority this year. Strategic partnerships, like the collaboration with Kaiser Permanente of Georgia, bolster Center priorities. Our new relationship with Kaiser Permanente is significant in sponsoring several of the Center's key initiatives, including the Unity Garden, volunteer program, senior programming, and the annual Corporate Eco Challenge event. This collaboration highlights their commitment to fostering healthy living and strengthening community connections through nature, volunteerism, and education. Carriage Kia sponsored the development and marketing of a year-long Center-based podcast, "Your Place on the River," and provided the Center with a Kia loaner vehicle. During its first 6 months, this vehicle was used to safely and stylishly deliver our Naturalists to 103 Educational Outreaches and 10 rehabilitated wildlife releases. Carriage Kia will open a new location in Alpharetta this fall, and we are excited to further engage both of our stakeholders.

CNC's ambitious Growing Tomorrow's Nature Enthusiasts (GTNE) Capital Campaign aims to expand facilities and programs, directly benefiting the community. Recent achievements include the successful completion of improvements for Camp Kingfisher and the Center entrance (including updated signage), with more enhancements on the horizon.

As CNC moves forward, its commitment to environmental stewardship and education remains unwavering, ready to inspire and foster a deeper appreciation for the natural world in the community and beyond.

EDUCATION

In 2024, CNC Education Programs reached 52,000 individuals, including 28,000 through offsite Outreach programs. Key partnerships expanded CNC's reach across diverse communities, including Fulton County schools, Atlanta Public Schools, among others, through nature-based, inclusive programming.

VISITOR ENGAGEMENT

In 2024, thousands of visitors connected with nature on CNC's campus, with 87% visiting from the greater metro-Atlanta area. Visitors enjoyed notable campus improvements, including new interpretive signage and a revamped Butterfly Encounter welcome area, made possible through the efforts of scouting projects, student contributions, and our skilled staff.



- 18,000 visitors attended the Butterfly Encounter, CNC's summer exhibit, over its 10 weeks of operation
- 4,000 visitors utilized CNC's Georgia Library Pass **Program**, granting free admission to passholders
- 7,300 participants in community events, including festivals, races and Family Fun Days
- 3,400 CNC Member Households

OPERATIONS

In 2024, CNC's wildlife rehabilitation team made a serious impact protecting Georgia's native species, caring for 788 injured, orphaned, and displaced animals from across the region, including Marietta (101), Atlanta (93), Roswell (71), and Canton (28). These animals represented 63 species and 63% of raptors and 93% of reptiles that survived the critical first 24 hours were successfully released back into the wild. The highlight of 2024 was relocating nearly 150 invasive red-eared sliders to their native range in the Mississippi River basin, protecting Georgia's waterways and native wildlife.

Our horticultural conservation team made notable strides in advancing native plant conservation and education. They are excited to announce that CNC will receive Recovery Challenge financial support for both 2024 and 2025, enabling us to expand our efforts in preserving native plant species. In addition, the team offered 11 educational programs, covering a range of topics from plant propagation techniques to carnivorous plants, fostering a deeper connection to native species and their importance in local ecosystems.

And our horticulture team made great progress in improving the Center's grounds, adding 1,001 new plants to our beds, collections, and the revitalized powerline right-of-way. The annual "Go Wild with Your Gardening!" Horticulture Symposium sold out in just 18 days, drawing 97 new visitors to CNC and reflecting growing enthusiasm for native plants. Additionally, 10,000 native plants and wildflowers now thrive in metro Atlanta gardens, thanks to our popular Spring and Fall Native Plant Sales, deepening the connection between our community and the natural world.

The diverse species thriving on CNC's campus highlight the health of the grounds and the watershed we protect. Notable sightings in 2024 include:

- 1,892 pollinators counted by dedicated volunteers during the Great Southeast Pollinator Census.
- Great Blue Herons return to the rookery by Kingfisher Pond for the 3rd year in a row.


